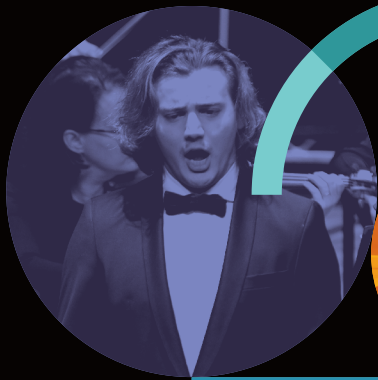

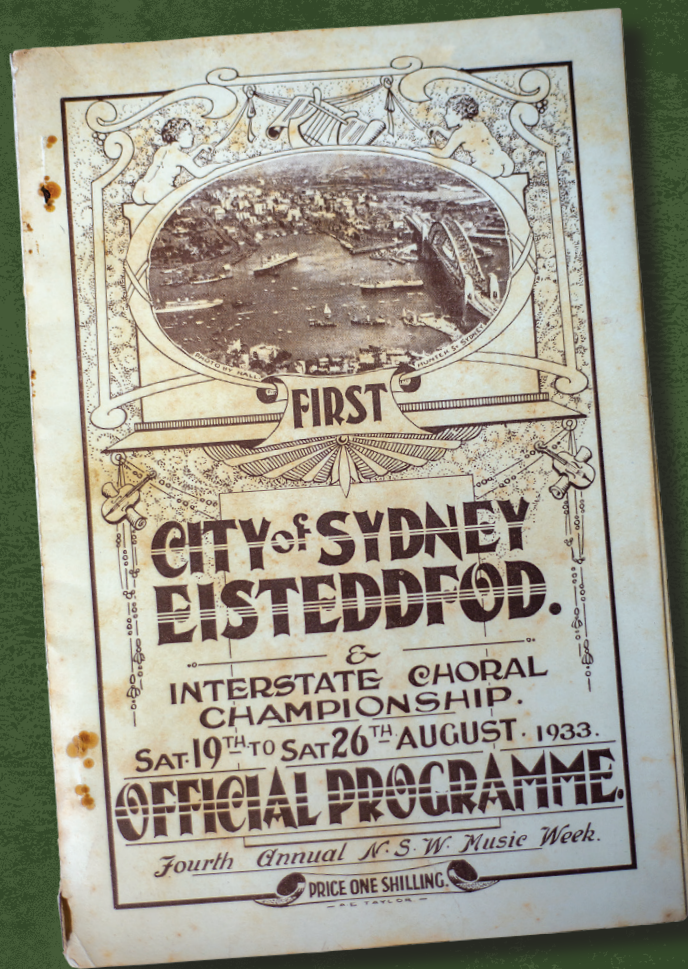

## Deputy Mayor Ellsmore Representing The Lord Mayor of Sydney

Councillor Sylvie Ellsmore is the Deputy Mayor of the City of Sydney Council, and a former Councillor on Marrickville Council (in Sydney's inner west). She was elected as a Greens Councillor to the City of Sydney Council in 2021.

Clr Ellsmore is a founding member and Chair of the City of Sydney's Housing for All Working Group, and Deputy Chair of the City's Housing for All Committee. During her time as a City of Sydney Councillor, Clr Ellsmore has helped stop the sell-off of public housing, secured free community space hire for community groups, increased developer contributions for affordable housing, campaigned against anti-protest laws and police intimidation, pushed the city to ban fossil fuel advertising, exposed special deals made to benefit the Star Casino, organised for the first Trans and Gender Diverse Swim Day in the city (the first of many), protected public parks and made it easier to reclaim the streets for community street parties.

Clr Ellsmore is committed to making Sydney an inclusive place for the whole community, not just the rich, and to supporting the community to lead change both inside and outside of Council. Prior to joining Council Clr Ellsmore worked as a community campaigner, native title lawyer, researcher and senior policy manager for the NSW Government. She has coordinated major independent reviews of government programs on cultural heritage, environmental laws, community legal centre funding, unemployment services, homelessness and domestic violence.

## Dr Nicholas Milton AM Conductor

The only Australian conductor ever nominated for a GRAMMY® award, Nicholas Milton has been Chief Conductor and Artistic Director of the Willoughby Symphony Orchestra for more than two decades. He is also currently Chief Conductor and Artistic Director of the Göttingen Symphony Orchestra, with whom he has just released a critically acclaimed recording of the complete symphonies of Brahms. In Austria, Milton serves until 2025 as General Music Director of the State Opera House in Klagenfurt, where he is conducting a new production of Wagner's *Ring Cycle*.
